



### THE MASTHEAD PLANE

If every plane you build comes out with a banana body, maybe you should be modeling a real plane with a banana body! The 1929 Couzinet 70 arc-en-ciel (rainbow) was designed to carry mail across the South Atlantic. Although the first two models were destroyed, one in a crash and the other in a fire, the third was successful and in 1933 went from Lt. Louis, Senegal to Natal, Brazil in 14 hours, 27 minutes. The odd body shape is actually the result of an extremely long fin faired into a conventional oval cross-section body. The plane was powered by three Hisso 12-cylinder Vee engines producing 650 h.p. each, and could hit a pseed of 174 m.p.h. The wingspan was 98½ feet, and the plane could carry 1,320 pounds plus a crew of four for a range of 4,225 miles.

There are a few challenges for the modeler...huge wheel spats, complex curves for the body/fin, and a large fairing to blend the wing into the body, along with three engines. At least you don't have to deal with retracts!

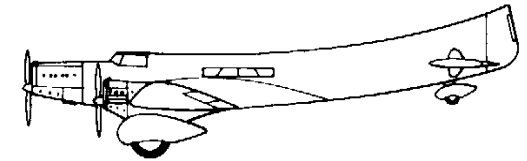
